On your EFT pay slips, you'll find an explanation of settlement and/or tips to help you bill better. Message #171 focuses on billing for fees less than \$500 and disbursements less than \$50. Please refrain from billing fees less than \$500 and disbursements less than \$50 except on final accounts or where necessary to meet billing deadlines. Limiting the number of small interim accounts submitted on a certificate will help us process your accounts and requests for discretion and reviews more efficiently and pay you faster!!

LAO has a first charge: S. 47 Directions

Tariff and Billing Handbook p.7-6

Pursuant to s.47 of the Legal Aid Services Act, LAO has a first charge against any interest in money or property a legally aided client recovers or becomes entitled to as a result of legal aid services. If there is any likelihood that a legally aided client may become entitled to money or property (e.g., award of damages or compensation from a court or tribunal, sale of matrimonial home, equalization payment, lump sum support, support arrears), at the outset you should advise the client and the Area Office. To avoid any allegation by the client that you did not advise him or her, you should have the client sign a written direction to Legal Aid Ontario and to yourself. If a legally aided client has become entitled to money or property as a result of legal aid services, you are required to take steps to secure LAO's interest in the client's entitlement.
