I am a lawyer and member in good standing with the Law Society of Ontario. I will immediately notify LAO if my status with the Law Society of Ontario changes.

I have read and agree to comply with the General Terms and Conditions for panel members.

I agree to comply with the <u>Legal Aid Services Act (LASA) SO 1998 c.26</u> and its regulations and schedules.

I agree to comply with all applicable panel standards.

I agree to comply with LAO's policies and procedures set out in LAO's <u>Tariff and Billing Handbook</u>, <u>Disbursements Handbook</u> and <u>Duty Counsel Manual</u>.

I will submit all accounts through Legal Aid Online.

I am aware that any false or misleading statement or representation with respect to online accounts and any supporting documentation, including the concealment or omission of any material fact, may result in LAO refusing to pay the account or recovering payment of the account, LAO revoking my *Legal Aid Online* Portal privileges and may be grounds for my removal from all LAO panels, civil or criminal prosecution, and reporting me to the Law Society of Ontario.

If empanelled, I understand that it is my responsibility to update all changes to my contact information that I have provided through *Legal Aid Online* or alternatively by emailing LAO's finance department at <u>finsolemp@lao.on.ca</u> for the purpose of panel activities, certificates, and billing, as soon as such changes occur. Failure to update LAO of changes to my contact information may result in removal from the panel without notice.

I understand that if I am empanelled, and should I fail to comply with one or more of the above criteria, LAO may take steps, up to and including, removal from the panel.

I am aware of my obligations under the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA), and have <u>completed the required AODA training</u> as set out in <u>LAO's AODA Policy</u>.

- LAO will still consider the application of a candidate involved in such a matter, if LAO is of the opinion that the nature of the situation is such that it would not prevent the candidate from being ineligible for consideration. Where the matter has yet to be determined, LAO may delay empanelment eligibility until the complaint is resolved.
- Candidates will generally not be considered if they have been sanctioned by a law society. LAO will consider mitigating circumstances concerning the sanction, which is not necessarily a bar to consideration.
- 3. Candidates will generally not be considered if they have an outstanding errors and omissions claim registered with the Lawyers' Professional Indemnity Company. However, if LAO receives information that the claim is not substantiated, then such a claim may not be a bar to the candidate being considered.
- 4. LAO will still consider the application of a candidate involved in such a situation if, after receiving further information, LAO is of the opinion that the nature of the situation would not make the candidate ineligible.
