Objectives of Legal Aid Ontario's

RACIALIZED COMMUNITIES ACTION PLAN



Legal Aid Ontario's Racialized Communities Action Plan is a 10-year plan that commits LAO to 17 specific objectives to be achieved by 2030.

To ensure that racialized clients do not face barriers to receiving LAO's services LAO will:

- Develop and use a tool that will help LAO make sure that our decisions do not unfairly affect racialized people
- Make sure that racialized people are proportionately represented among LAO's clients
- Find out why so many clients are not using their child protection certificates, and, if possible, fix the problem
- 4. Translate information about LAO into a number of languages and make this information available to everyone
- 5. Make it easier for clients to access interpreters
- 6. Help clients more easily find out if lawyers and paralegals can provide services in different languages

To make sure that LAO's services are of a high quality, LAO will:

- 7. Work to make sure that the percentage of racialized people working in all levels of LAO is at least equal to the percentage of racialized people among low-income Ontarians
- Support clinics and other service providers to better respond to the needs of low-income racialized people in Ontario
- Translate into different languages information about what clients should expect of LAO lawyers and how to file a complaint
- 10. Work to make sure that LAO regularly receives positive feedback from clients about things like how easy it is to find a lawyer and the quality of services
- 11. Revise LAO's processes so things like job interviews, performance

- reviews, and lawyer application forms contain questions about racial justice
- 12. Regularly provide all legal aid lawyers with training on racial justice

To combat systemic racism in the justice system, LAO will:

- 13. Work to make sure that we reward lawyers who achieve positive results for clients and do not reward lawyers who do not
- 14. Regularly provide lawyers with training and information about how to challenge racism in the justice system
- 15. Check to see if lawyers are making arguments about race (e.g. racial profiling and Charter-based arguments), where appropriate
- 16. Support community development projects that are about issues that impact racialized communities
- 17. Work to make sure that there are no differences between the legal outcomes for LAO's racialized clients and LAO white clients
