Coverage for second bail hearings where the Crown does not bring a section 524 application

Where charges are added and ultimately resolved together, no coverage is provided for second bail hearings that take place separately unless the Crown brings a section 524 application. Roster members must request discretion for hourly matters. There is no additional payment in block fee matters.

Permit roster members to bill another "first bail" for charges resolved together where there are separately occurring bail hearings. Four hours on hourly certificates and \$638.15 on block fee certificates.

No action required from roster member.

This issue can also occur where two separate certificates are issued and both sets of charges are set for trial (billed hourly), but they later resolve can only bill on one hourly tariff certificate and they are required to ask for discretion for the second non-section 524 bail.

Change to the "set down for trial" question on the criminal account page

Current question: "Have any of these Charges been set down for a Contested Trial?" (yes/no radio buttons). Once yes is selected the account is paid hourly.

Language determines whether the payment will be block or hourly based on when the account is submitted rather than when the service was provided.

Revised question will allow roster members to submit a block fee account for services provided before it was set down for trial but billed after it was set down for trial.

Revised question: "Were any of these Charges set down for a Contested Trial prior to the last date of service billed on this account?"

Select appropriate response to revised question to determine whether account will be paid hourly or by block fee.

If the matter has been set down for trial and you have a block fee service to bill, which occurred prior to the matter being set down for trial, please ensure you bill that service as a block fee account prior to selecting "yes".

Alignment of language regarding continuations for guilty pleas

When attributing additional tariff for Summary and Indictable 1 guilty plea continuations, tables 4(2) and 5(4) of Schedule 2 use different language to describe what constitutes a full day.

Consistent language applied to Schedule 2 of the Legal Aid Services Rules. Both tables 4(2) and 5(4) include the phrase "the first full day or two half days" when referring to guilty plea continuations.

No action required from roster member.

Authorization for use of interpreters

No current tariff allotment or block fee.

A two-hour tariff authorization or a \$191.44 block fee will be added automatically when an inherent interpreter disbursement is billed. This compensates roster members for time spent communicating through an interpreter. If the enhancer does not appear on the certificate, the roster member may submit a written request through the online portal.
